Result: Hurley 1st won by 31 runs.

Hurley started their season with the traditional Ashes match between the two Sunday teams. With several players missing at Jack Burton's stag weekend a nine a side game was played.

The 1^{sts}, captained for the first time by Matt Hampton, were asked to bat first and got off to the worst possible start when Darryn Wright was run out without scoring thanks to a direct hit from Dan Masters.

Dave Forrest (30) and Mike Walton (33) got the innings going with a partnership of fifty-four for the second wicket. The loss of Forrest, caught behind off Masters, precipitated a mini collapse as Giles Pergl-Wilson and Matt Hampton both failed to trouble the scorers. Sam Draper (13) and Ross Brown (17) shared partnerships of thirty-three and twenty-six with Walton to take the score to 114 for 6 in the thirty-third over. Only four more runs were added as the 1^{sts} were dismissed for 118. Dan Masters (3 for 21) and Stefan Pandia (2 for 21) were the pick of the bowlers.

The 2^{nds} reply also got off to a stuttering start with Cameron Duffel clean bowled by Dave Forrest in the second over. The next over saw Pat Hinnell hit on the head by a short delivery from Wright and forced to depart for medical treatment. Forrest picked up the wicket of Jim Fenwick in the fourth over to reduce the 2^{nds} to 9 for 2. Jo Simon (38*) and Julian Van Loo (2) restored some respectability with a partnership of seventeen, but Van Loo proved no match for the pace of Wright. With Stefan Pandia losing his off stump trying to hit Ross Brown out of the ground the score subsided to 28 for 4. Dan Masters (25) and Jo Simon gave their side a glimmer of hope with a partnership of forty-nine for the fifth wicket but the reintroduction of Forrest (3 for 8) into the attack accounted for Masters, leg before. Rennie Campbell only managed a single before being run out by Matt Hampton, helped by a deflection from Forrest and with his departure went any hope of the 2^{nds} retaining the Ashes. Robert Simon survived for 16 deliveries before Dave Walton trapped him leg before to give the 1^{sts} victory.
