A brilliant rearguard action by Giles Pergl-Wilson and Mike Walton earned Hurley a well deserved draw against a strong Economicals side at Shepherds Lane on Sunday. The Economicals opted to bat first and took a few overs to get into their stride against Hurley's opening attack, Dave Walton and Ross Brown. Both the bowlers picked up an early wicket to reduce the visitors to forty-three for two after nine overs. Hurley's youngsters showed great enthusiasm in the field despite this being their second game of the day and some heavy partying the night before. It was no surprise when the third wicket fell to a run out, Ross Brown sending an accurate throw to the keeper to dismiss the Economicals skipper Rehan for thirty-seven. Not to be outdone in the fielding stakes, George Lewis followed suit to dismiss Mo (16) and Economicals found themselves four wickets down for 127 after twenty-three overs. Mohammed (59) and Famir (47) looked like posting a huge target but the home side kept plugging away. Brown (3-74), Sam Draper (2-32) and Giles Pergl-Wilson (2-21), aided by some very good catches dismissed the visitors for 223 in 35.2 overs.

The Hurley reply started in aggressive style with George Lewis smashing the first ball of the innings from Minal over square-leg for six. Minal recovered to dismiss Sam Draper (0) and John Draper (2) inside the first three overs. The loss of Lewis (15) left Hurley tottering on thirty for three. Ross Brown (20) and Mike Walton added twenty-seven for the fourth wicket and Jeff Dawson (15) and Steve Kennewell (15) both made useful contributions but Hurley were gradually dropping behind the required run rate. Once again Mike Walton (45*) played the anchor roll for Hurley and even a blow on the helmet from Famir could not dislodge him. When Andrew Kennewell fell in the thirty-second over, the home side were still nine overs from safety with one wicket remaining. Giles Pergl-Wilson joined his skipper in the middle and played the innings of his life to defy the bowlers, finishing with a career best 25* and earning his side a share of the spoils as Hurley finished on 171 for 9.
