This week's match report is written in the style of a bog standard match report (sorry).

Hurley entertained Holyport on a humid July day in a compelling but sadly underwhelming performance. After winning the toss Holyport chose to bat, and with Robert Simon typically late, Adams shared the new ball with the returning Ren Campbell. A couple of tight early overs paid dividends as Campbell found the outside edge of openers Harris' bat and he departed without troubling the scorers.

The other Holyport opener (76) anchored the innings as the score moved forwards but with regular wickets going down. A smart run out from captain Hooper and 3 quick wickets from Adams, now back bowling his favoured spin left Holyport struggling at 111 for 5. Hooper and Todd chipped in with 3 wickets between them but with Hurley taking their foot off the gas, and with several dropped catches, Holyport reached a somewhat disappointing 194 for 8 from the home team's point of view. It looked a difficult target on a pitch with variable bounce and turn.

After a delightful pizza heavy tea prepared by Mrs H, Hurley set about retrieving their target. Jonathan Simon made a rare appearance back at the top of the order with Rob Smith and life proved difficult with the Holyport opening bowlers showing genuine pace from both ends. Smith, followed by Sawtell, Hooper and Hinnell all fell for less than double figures leaving Hurley reeling at 33-4.

Debutante Greg Double joined J. Simon at the crease and the two of them put on an excellent 5th wicket partnership of 71 to give Hurley a glimmer of hope. A tired Simon finally departed for a well-constructed 41 and a flurry of quick wickets left Double running out of partners. He was the last wicket to fall for a quick fire 39 as Hurley ended on a below par 118 all out.
