Result: Match Drawn

The penultimate game of the league season at Shepherds Lane saw Hurley 2nd XI take on divisional champions Wraysbury 2nd XI. A monsoon like downpour just before play was due to start led to a two hour delay to allow the wicket to dry out. Wraysbury lost the toss and were invited to bat first in a match reduced to 60 overs. There was an end of season party feel to the Wraysbury team as they re-jigged their batting order. Skipper Andy Davies (45) opened with Mohammed Kazi (16) and Kazi was lucky to survive the first over, edging Ejaz Hussain to Mike Walton who grassed a straight forward chance. Both batsmen rode their luck, hitting in the air on several occasions without finding a fielder. The score had reached 21 in the seventh over when Hussain found the edge of Kazi's bat again and this time Walton was not so profligate, gratefully pouching the catch. Davies was joined by Pave Midha (46) and employed the leg side shovel to good effect to add 77 for the second wicket. Midha tried one big shot too many and was well caught on the mid-wicket boundary by Ejaz Hussain. Davies became Pollitt's third victim, skying a top edge which Walton ran forward to claim. Taranjeet Singh (46*) scored the majority of the remaining runs as Wraysbury finished on 182 for 7. Leg spinner Mesome Hussain picked up the wickets of Kibble (4) and Deep Singh (15).

Hurley sent in their big guns early in an attempt to chase down the large total and Yasir Ali (32) and Ejaz Hussain (17) started in fiery style, posting 30 in the first 3 overs. Hussain was the first to go, caught on the mid-wicket boundary by Imran Ahmed off Sanjay Sood. The score had progressed to fifty after seven overs when the introduction of Deep Singh (4-18) turned the game on its head with a hat-trick. Steve Taylor (7) was the first to go, unlucky to be bowled by a delivery which kept low. Mohammed Ali pushed his first ball straight back to the bowler and Mesome Hussain was adjudged leg before to the next delivery. Yasir Ali edged to the keeper a couple of overs later, followed by Imran Arshad, caught and bowled Kazi. Hurley were effectively out of the game at 61 for 6. A determined rearguard action by Clive Williams (21*) and Mudasser Iqbal (37*) saw Hurley to the close and a respectable 130 for 6, gaining 5 points which guarantee their survival in Division3.
