## Result: Purley won by 190 runs

Hurley's poor Sunday batting form continued as they went down to a 190 run defeat at Purley. Missing a few of their regular players, Hurley won the toss and opted to bowl first in a forty over match. Will Deathridge helped himself to a quick thirty runs, punishing anything short, before getting a leading edge back to Steve Taylor. Peter Rackley (88) and George Wheeler (33) compiled a partnership of 73 in thirteen overs for the second wicket, ended when Wheeler holed out to Jono Patrick at long-off to give Bert Simon his only success. Wheeler was replaced by Paul Reber (72\*) who together with Rackley piled on the agony for Hurley, adding 96 for the third wicket. Mark Allen (2-33) made the breakthrough, Rackley getting a feint bottom edge to the keeper. Allen followed up with the wicket of Khan who hit his first delivery down the throat of Patrick. A further 53 runs were added in the final four overs as the hosts finished on 266 for 4.

The Hurley reply never really got going, losing two wickets for four runs in the first two overs. A solid partnership of forty between Steve Taylor (28) and Mark Allen

(17) for the third wicket was the only highlight of the innings as wickets fell at regular intervals. None of the other batsmen reached double figures and the Hurley cause was not helped by three run outs, with Mike Walton the guilty party for two of them. Once Taylor departed, one of three 'caught and bowled' dismissals, at 54 for 4, the writing was on the wall and there was only pride to play for. Roger Deathridge with 3 for 5 from 8 overs proved almost impossible for the Hurley batsmen to get away and the end came swiftly as the last three wickets fell for only 11 runs.
