## Result: Hurley 2nds won by 207 runs.

Hurley 2nds finished off their Marrant Chilterns League season with a record breaking performance at Great Kingshill. Mike Walton won the toss and opted to bat first but was soon questioning the wisdom of this decision as the visitors slumped to 28 for 4 inside 15 overs. Mital Pandit (1-82) and Ian Talmer (2-46) aided by an unpredictable pitch destroyed the Hurley top order. Walton and Parvinder Hunjan safely negotiated the first 11 overs before Hunjan was controversially given out to a catch at slip which did not appear to have carried to Pandit. Mesome Hussain only lasted five deliveries, before adjudged leg before to Talmer. The next over saw Walton bowled by a shooter from Pandit and when Imran Arshad chipped a soft catch to mid-on, Hurley looked like been bowled out for a low score. Ejaz Hussain took the bull by the horns and blasted 27 from 17 deliveries before being stumped by the vociferous, pre-pubescent Joe Thomas. Yasir Ali took a few deliveries to get his eye in before launching an assault the likes of which had never been seen before by a Hurley player. Together with Mudasser Iqbal (40\*) the pair compiled an unbroken 7<sup>th</sup> wicket partnership of 197 in 19 overs, breaking the previous record which had only lasted two weeks. Ali's innings contained 30 boundaries and six sixes, two of which damaged cars in the recycling centre across the road and one into the allotments beyond. Ali's score surpassed the previous highest score by a Hurley batsman of 183 by Kunal Nandwani and the total of 313 is the highest 2<sup>nd</sup> XI

total by Hurley. Once Ali achieved his double century, Walton called in the batsmen for a well earned tea.

After the break Jonathan Langlands and Ejaz Hussain opened the attack for Hurley, keeping a tight grip on the run rate to frustrate the Kingshill batsmen. Hussain achieved the early breakthrough, finding the inside edge of Carl Selby's bat on the way through to the keeper in the eighth over. Two overs later, Hussain struck again, trapping Young leg before. Dave Pinner (10) and Mukesh Pandit (8) provided some stubborn resistance for five overs before the introduction of young leg spinner Mesome Hussain paid immediate dividends, the youngster deceiving Pinner with a quicker delivery to clip the off stump. None of the middle order had any answer to the flight and variations of Hussain and the hosts quickly slumped to 44 for 6. Pandit's resistance was ended by Dave Pollitt finding a bottom edge as Pandit tried to cut. Freddie Pestana (21) and Ryan Greenstreet (17) played some attacking shots in a late show of defiance but it was too little too late from Kingshill as Hussain wrapped up the innings, Parvinder Hunjan taking a good catch low down at slip to record Hurley 2nds highest ever margin of victory.
