Result: Hurley 1st XI won by 5 wickets

The latest in the series of Ashes matches between the two Hurley Sunday sides saw the 1sts retain the coveted urn in a forty over contest.

On calling correctly, 2s skipper Dan Masters opted to bat first and sent out the experience of Pat Hinnell and young exuberance of George Lewis to open the innings. Basharat' opening couple of overs only conceded one wide, whilst at the other end Lewis plundered a quick fourteen off the bowling of David Morgans. Unbowed by the onslaught, Morgans stuck to his line and length and was rewarded when an agricultural swipe from Lewis only succeeded in deflecting the ball onto the middle stump. Paul Todd failed to trouble the scorers before being adjudged leg before to Morgans bringing Jo Simon to the middle to join his uncle. Simon started in his usual stoic way but gradually got into his stride building a partnership of 54 for the third wicket. Inevitably it was the diminutive Morgans who ended the stand trapping Hinnell in front as he shuffled across his stumps. Craig Selvage helped accelerate the scoring with an unbeaten 65 and Simon reached his maiden half-

century to rapturous applause from his team mates as 83 was added for the fourth wicket. Langlands was brought on to bowl the final overs and picked up the wickets of Simon (51) and Jack Chambers (0) as the batsmen swung at everything to push the score up to a respectable 180 for 6 from 40 overs. Matt Hampton sent in his two left handers, Phil Ridgeway and Shoaib Kayani to open the reply and they wasted no time in punishing some wayward bowling from Bert Simon who was withdrawn after his opening two overs cost 32 runs. Adam Brackstone replaced Simon but struggled to find a consistent line against the left handed batsmen, who continued to score heavily on the leg side. The opening partnership reached 90 inside 11 overs before Brackstone (1-37) sent Ridgeway (40) back to the pavilion. Scott Taylor (22) continued his good form of the weekend sharing in a second wicket partnership of 75 with Kayani. Kayani continued to flay the bowling to all parts and was in sight of a century when he charged down the track to Todd (1-30) and was easily stumped by Lewis. Matt Hampton was dropped on nought by Lewis and responded by hitting Masters over the club roof for six before top edging to slip where Jack Chambers held the catch. With only two runs needed for victory the game looked over but there was drama to the last as two wickets were lost with the scores level. Mike Walton went out with one run needed and proceeded to run out Alan Morgans before edging Craig Selvage's only delivery to third man for the required run, giving the 1sts victory by 5 wickets with 16 overs to spare.
