A rather pathetic batting performance by Hurley saw them skittled for 78 in 24 overs at Lowther Road before the persistent rain curtailed the afternoon's entertainment. Home skipper Paul Hunsdon won the toss and invited the visitors to bat first. Mike Walton's poor form continued as he departed second delivery to Charlie Sawyer. Josh Cole looked in good nick until hanging his bat out to a Tom Alborough delivery, giving Parry a simple catch behind the stumps. Debutant, Joe Wilson played a sumptuous push down the ground for a

boundary but fell a couple of deliveries later, chipping Alborough into the waiting hands of Balakrishnan at mid-wicket. Akash Singh (13) and Clive Williams (22) staged a recovery with a rain interrupted partnership of 41 for the fourth wicket. The loss of Singh bowled by Balakrishnan, prompted a collapse as Hurley lost seven wickets for sixteen runs in seven overs. The visitors did not help themselves, a suicidal single by Williams saw him run out by a distance when sent back by Graham and some injudicious shot selection followed as the middle order and tail were blown away. The players managed to stay out in the drizzle long enough for Emmbrook & Bearwood to gain maximum bowling points. Tea was taken, but heavy rain left the square and outfield sodden, causing the captains to call off the match without a ball being bowled in the second innings.
