Result: Hurley won by 50 runs.

Hurley's Sunday side made their first away trip of the season, visiting the picturesque Welford Park ground situated high on the Berkshire Downs.

With the skipper and half the team trying to navigate their way through the M4 diversions, Mike Walton deputised at the toss, called wrongly, and was invited to bat. The opening pair of Clive Williams and Mike Cole struggled to get the ball away on a pitch that proved to be inconsistent, reaching 15 in the ninth over when a superb one-handed catch off his own bowling by Bhargav Sutapalli sent Williams back to the pavilion. Cole followed in the next over with the score on 21. Mandeep Singh entered the fray in typical fashion, hitting the first two deliveries he received from Sutapalli to the boundary. Unfortunately for Hurley, his innings was short lived, falling for 21 to Tarrier at 44 for 3 in the thirteenth. Solidity was

called for and this was provided by Liam Cole with a gritty 26, in a partnership of 71 with Shoaib Kayani for the fifth wicket. The loss of Cole to the veteran left-arm spinner Ian Herrington precipitated a mini collapse with Dave Walton (0) and Maz Nabi (2) falling in consecutive overs. Kayani (55*) and Mike Walton (9*) saw Hurley through to a respectable 171 for 7 from their 40 overs.

The Hurley opening attack kept a tight rein on the runs with Mike Harrison and Austin Keep struggling to get the rate above three an over. The Welford cause was not helped when Keep was forced to retire hurt with a hamstring strain. The dismissal of Lewis Hunt (3) by Mo Basharat brought JP Van Der Walt to the crease and he wasted no time, smashing his second delivery down the ground for a maximum. He raced to 21 from 10 balls before an aerial push off Singh travelled to long off where Maz Nabi held on, much to the relief of his team mates. Singh (3-23) and Liam Cole (3-38) took regular wickets and forced up the required rate to more than five an over. When Singh bowled Ian Herrington (19) in the 32nd over, any hopes Welford Park had of victory disappeared. Only seven more runs were added before a direct hit from Singh to run out Kynaston finished off the innings with Archie Keep absent, the hosts were dismissed, fifty runs short in the 34th over.
